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Highlights of the Regional Board meeting - May 13, 2021

2020 Audited Financial Statements

The Regional Board has approved the 2020 Audited Financial Statements for the Regional District of Central Okanagan and Central Okanagan Regional Hospital District. Copies along with a Guide to Understanding Financial Statements are available for viewing online at rdco.com/budgets.

Okanagan Regional Library bylaws

The Regional Board has given third reading to amended bylaws for establishing a service and authorizing a loan on behalf of the Okanagan Regional Library (ORL). The Board rescinded a previous third reading after the Province requested minor changes to each bylaw. The new service proposes construction of a new library facility and the loan authorization bylaw would allow the RDCO to borrow funds from the Municipal Finance Authority on behalf of the ORL for a new West Kelowna branch. A report on a proposed Alternative Approval Process to register public support of the bylaws will be presented for Board consideration.

Building Inspections Service update

The Regional Board has received a report reviewing the Building Inspection service and supports the current delivery model for the program. The Board also gave two readings to new Building and Development Application Fees and Charges bylaws. The proposed bylaws will be referred to the development community for comments before the Board considers final adoption.

Grant applications supported

The Regional Board supports a request from staff to apply for two grants to help complete a Regional Agricultural Strategy. The strategy for agriculture is one of the important projects identified in the Regional Growth Strategy Priority Projects plan and would help with knowledge sharing, data collection and consistent regional policies for the region's agricultural food system.

- BC Healthy Communities PlanH program -\$15,000
- Investment Agriculture Foundation Local Government Partnership program - \$40,000

Planning application extension request

The Regional Board has approved a one-year extension for a zoning amendment bylaw application (Z20-04 – Owners D. Leask/S. Macdonald) at 4345 Maxwell Road in the Central Okanagan West Electoral Area. The applicant continues efforts to resolve a number of outstanding Board requirements identified in May 2020 when the application was initially considered.

Regional Air Quality program update

The Regional Board has received a detailed update on all the programs and services provided through the Regional Air Quality program. The Board directs staff to bring forward strategies to reduce fine particles (PM2.5) not visible to the naked eye but are the most serious air pollutant in BC and prepare an updated Smoke Control bylaw (No. 773) for Board consideration. The 2021-2025 Financial Plan also increased the Air Quality budget by \$40,000 a year to help meet demand for the Agricultural Chipping program. The Board also supports sending a letter to the two other valley regional districts offering a presentation by Air Quality program staff on the benefits of a valley-wide air shed approach.

The Keynote Speaker, Diane Kalen-Sukra's presentation, "Addressing Culture Risk: Civic Leaders as Culture Shapers" was quite thought-provoking. The question of the role of culture and the kind of culture needed was explored in detail. She postulated that in order to make cities safe, inclusive, resilient and sustainable, change is needed, as cities are on the brink of cultural collapse. Community building is a social process. Technology alone will not lead to sustainable institutions but cultivating a compassionate, human culture will have government do the right things for the right reasons, she says.

The resolutions (31) were presented with opportunities for discussion, although most (25) passed without debate. One resolution was withdrawn and 5 were defeated. There were no late resolutions.

The UBCM President, Brian Frenkel, gave a short address. He planned to be meeting with several MLAs in the near future to discuss UNDRIP and DRIPPA. He sees two major topics at the present time - bringing clarity to Reconciliation, and the Opioid Crisis, and of course other important issues such as Housing and Climate Change. He thanked all of the SILGA members for the good work we are doing under the pressure of these times.

Incoming President Karla Kozakevich spoke of how well SILGA members are adapting to work in this COVID-19 era. She introduced Mayor Alan Harrison of Salmon Arm who invited us all to the 2022 AGM to be held (hopefully) next April 26-29. He says we have lots to talk about and learn from each other, a time to think, talk, and enjoy.
