

### **Resident Electors**

#### Qualifications

As a resident of West Kelowna, you may vote if you are:

- 18 years of age or older on voting day
- A Canadian citizen
- · A resident living in British Columbia for at least six months before voting (April 14, 2022)
- Not disqualified from voting due to an election offence or otherwise disqualified by law

#### Same day registration

As a resident elector in the City of West Kelowna you will register to vote at the polling station.

#### **Non-Resident Electors**

#### Qualifications

A non-resident elector is one who owns property in the City of West Kelowna but lives in another jurisdiction.

If you are a non-resident property elector of West Kelowna, you may vote if you are:

- 18 years of age or older on voting day
- A Canadian citizen
- Have lived in British Columbia for at least six months before voting (April 14, 2022)
- Have owned property within the City of West Kelowna for at least 30 days before voting (September 14, 2022)
- Not disqualified from voting due to an election offence or otherwise disqualified by law

#### Register as a Non-resident Voter

As a non-resident voter you will register to vote at the polling station. You must provide two pieces of identification (one with a signature) plus written consent from the majority of the property's co-owners to vote as the non-resident voter.

### **IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED**

When you arrive to vote, you must provide two separate pieces of identification (one with a signature) that identifies who you are and where you live.

Examples include:

- BC Driver's License
- BC Identification Card
- BC Services Card
- · Social Insurance Number Card
- Vehicle Insurance Papers
- Credit Card or Debit Card
- Passport



# **QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

- I own more than one property in West Kelowna, may I vote more than once?
  You may only vote once in the City of West Kelowna.
- 2. If multiple non-resident owners are listed on a property title, who can vote? Only one non-resident elector can vote. The non-resident elector must have written consent from the majority of the co-owners to vote as the non-resident elector.
- What if a company owns the property? No corporation is entitled to vote as an elector.
- 4. What if I own a property with someone and that person is living on the property and I am not? The person living on the property may be able to vote as a resident elector and you may be able to vote as a non-resident elector if you both meet the respective qualifications for resident and non-resident electors.
