





- CRIME REDUCTION
- During this quarter, the Community Safety Unit (CSU) recovered numerous stolen vehicles, license plates, and a U-Haul trailer.
- Multiple arrests were made for shoplifting, possession of stolen property, breach of probation, warrants and possession for the purpose of trafficking.
- By making proactive patrols CSU served numerous violation tickets for no insurance, fail to stop, drive contrary to
  restriction, no driver's license, no insurance, speeding, speeding in construction zones and school zones, and for
  excessive speeding impounds.
- The CSU team focused on Community Policing by assisting with the Rattlesnake Island Swim; they liaised with Interior Health in relation to a problem residence; and made patrols of a homeless encampment with the goal of keeping the area clean and discouraging campers from staying longer than permitted.





#### SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO)

- With the start of the school year, the School Resource Officer (SRO) reconnected with the school administration and with the teachers of the schools.
- The SRO sent out a message in the school newsletters to parents explaining who she is, what she does and how to reach her.
- The SRO conducted a presentation to a grade 2 class at Shannon Lake Elementary School on stranger safety. She also assisted with safety at their Terry Fox Run while cheering the kids along.
