West Kelowna Community Highlights

- Officers attended a residence to assist a man in crisis; the man was apprehended and transported to hospital. During the investigation, officers located volatile items that required the assistance of the Explosive Disposal Unit.
- The West Kelowna Crime Reduction Unit, Kelowna City Traffic and the BC Highway Patrol worked collaboratively to take a motorcyclist off the road who was driving dangerously and erratically in our communities over an extended period of time. Multiple charges have been forwarded to Crown Counsel.
- A driver ran over a curb at an elementary school almost hitting a child. The driver who was known to police was located and arrested while sitting in his car with thousands of dollars worth of illegal and dangerous drugs.
- Property Offences, Theft From Motor Vehicle and B&E Business offences are down this quarter as compared to the same time last year.
- Indigenous Policing Services along with WFN Chief and Council, West Kelowna Mayor, Detachment Commander, School
 Resource Officer, and Civilian Staff participated in a friendly charity basketball game against the students of Constable Neil
 Bruce School.
- The School Resource Officer attended a Youth Leadership Workshop at RCMP Depot in Regina with a Mount Boucherie Secondary School student to work on a community project.
- The Crime Reduction Unit worked with Natural Resources Officers in serving eviction notices to long-term campers who were set up on Crown Land on Bartley Road. Vehicles and campers were removed and residents were relocated to a more suitable location.




CRIME REDUCTION

CRIME REDUCTION UNIT (CRU)

In this quarter The Crime Reduction Unit (CRU):

- Targeted a prolific shoplifter who commits crime throughout the Okanagan. The offender was arrested on several occasions, merchandise was recovered and charges forwarded to Crown Counsel.
- · Recovered 6 stolen vehicles, resulting in four arrests. Charges approved by Crown Counsel.
- Updated the warrant list which resulted in 6 arrests.
- Targeted 2 prohibited drivers. Both were arrested while driving and their vehicles were impounded. CRU requested a warrant for the arrest of the passenger, a prolific offender, for breaching his conditions.
- Issued 34 violation tickets and written warnings.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO) INDIGENOUS POLICING SERVICES (IPS)

In this Quarter the School Resource Officer:

- Presented Healthy Relationships, Anger Management and Internet Safety talks to students at various schools in West Kelowna and Peachland.

- Gave a tour of the detachment to two resource students.
- The SRO assisted IPS with making and serving lunch to the students at Sensisyusten School.
