RE: 2018 Flood Recovery Update

BACKGROUND:

The Central Okanagan experienced high creek water discharges during the 2018 freshet in May and June. The Event was triggered by rapid melting of a much higher than normal snowpack. The BC River Forecast Centre (BCRFC) snow survey bulletin from May 1st, 2018 showed Okanagan snowpack at 206% of normal. Higher than normal temperatures in early May, combined with rainfall substantially reduced the snowpack, with the BCRFC bulletin reporting snowpack had decreased to 126% of normal by May 15th and by June 1st, it was down to 51%. It has been estimated that the City of West Kelowna experienced a return interval of 1 in 50-year event.

As a result of this rapid melting, the City of West Kelowna identified 8 different recovery projects on Smith, McDougall and Powers Creeks, and other unnamed drainage ditches.
