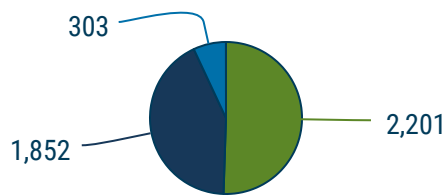

West Kelowna Community Highlights

- The West Kelowna Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) conducted a search warrant in Glenrosa which resulted in over 30,000 packages of illegal cigarettes being seized.
- CRU seized a large amount of cocaine, meth, fentanyl, GHB, 133 pills, two replica hand guns and bear spray. Two charges are pending for Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking.
- The School Resource Officer (SRO), CRU and some of our Community Policing Volunteers participated in the Annual Stuff the Cruiser Event held at the Real Canadian Superstore in West Kelowna. The event raised over 2,300 pounds of food, as well as \$847.
- On June 12-13, 2023, the Indigenous Policing Services (IPS), the SRO and the CNB Middle School Indigenous Youth Leadership group took part in a Canoe Journey. This canoeing/camping trip allowed the students an opportunity to be aware of their leadership potential in a challenging, engaging, and authentic environment. This group worked with the IPS team to create drums, learn traditional practices and traditional songs.
- The IPS Unit, along with the SRO organized the RCMP Indigenous Recruiting COP Camp at Mount Boucherie High School. The program brings high school aged youth together to participate in a program that familiarizes them with the RCMP. The goal is to help build better community relationships between the RCMP and indigenous communities while boosting the recruitment of Indigenous people in the RCMP.
- The SRO along with 35 students, stayed overnight at the Vernon Army camp for the Jean Minguy Memorial RCMP Youth Academy. The camp is a work experience program that provides students an opportunity to explore their career interests in law enforcement by providing a hands-on simulated police academy.

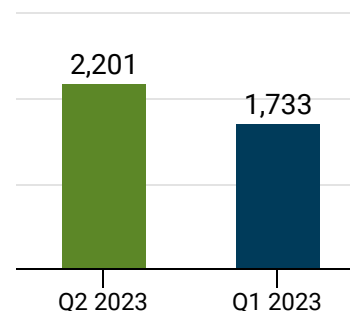
2023 Q2 ZONE COMPARISONS

CRIME REDUCTION UNIT (CRU)

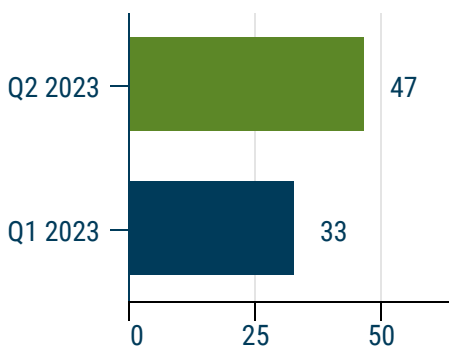
In this quarter The Crime Reduction Unit (CRU):

- Recovered a stolen Mercedes and a Kawasaki motorcycle.
- Conducted a Loss Prevention Project that resulted in 27 files, 20 shoplifters, 2 unendorsed warrants, 2 endorsed warrants, 2 drive while prohibited, 1 possession of illegal cigarettes, 2 no insurance and 3 people were removed from store
- Issued 17 traffic violation tickets, 6 warnings, 3 Notice and Orders, and 2 Drive While Prohibited.
