West Kelowna Community Highlights

- Officers of the West Kelowna RCMP detachment were deployed to wildfire evacuations, roadblocks and patrols to safeguard and secure evacuated areas and routes. Officers provided proactive patrols to these affected areas to deter any potential criminal activities. A Conservation Officer spotted a potential illegal lab which led to the RCMP executing a search warrant and seizing equipment from a hazardous lab in West Kelowna. RCMP officers identified the suspect of a break-and-enter at a large storage facility and worked quickly to prepare and execute two search warrants, which resulted in the recovery of dozens of stolen identification cards and credit cards.
- The Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) arrested a well-known prolific offender on 9 unendorsed warrants.
- A suspect was arrested for a series of charges, including 2nd degree murder, in relation to a fatal crash that occurred in West Kelowna.
- A 12-year-old girl that went missing was safely located and returned home by Officers.
- A West Kelowna Officer participated in the 2023 edition of the Cops for Kids 1,000 km bike ride. A grand total of \$315,000 was raised.
- The West Kelowna RCMP Detachment, along with students and staff from the Mount Boucherie and CNB schools organized a Truth and Reconciliation event on Friday September 29th. The City of West Kelowna Mayor, Officers and students departed by canoe from Kelowna City Park to the WFN beach lot. The journey followed traditional indigenous customs and protocol along the way. Paddlers presented the WFN Chief and Elders with an "Every Child Matters" gift from the Indigenous Leadership Class at CNB. WFN Elders were presented their survivor quilt. Participants and invited guests attended the West Kelowna Detachment for bannock and stew.


BCHP 2023 Q3 Stats for West Kelowna, Rural, and Peachland Total 541



CRIME REDUCTION UNIT (CRU)

In this Quarter CRU:

- Heavily assisted with the wildfire roadblocks and patrols during August and September. They did not initiate any large projects during this time in anticipation of the wildfire season.
- Aided Saskatchewan RCMP with a surveillance/arrest warrant on a child sex offender.
- Assisted the West Kelowna General Investigation Section with surveillance on a murder suspect.
- Kept the peace while Bylaws cleaned up a derelict yard at a problem residence on Applegreen Court.
- Recovered a stolen wakeboard boat out of Alberta; a stolen motorcycle and drugs; as well as, stolen rims and tires.
- Activated a cell phone tracker warrant and ultimately arrested a suspect on 2 warrants for Possession of Firearms.
- Arrested an offender breaching his conditions with the assistance of the Emergency Response Team.
- Issued 90 Immediate Roadside Prohibitions, 38 Traffic Violation Tickets, 2 Warnings, 1 Notice and Order.





SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO) INDIGENOUS POLICING SERVICES (IPS)

In this Quarter:

- The SRO sent letters to the schools in West Kelowna introducing herself and advising them of her role and responsibilities. She presented a safety information session to International students at the Green Bay Bible Camp and held a Stranger Safety presentation to students at the Glenrosa Elementary School.
- IPS held their annual RCMP and Indigenous Youth Canoe
 Journey. The goal of the journey is to foster stronger
 community relationships between aboriginal communities
 and the RCMP; as well as, connecting the youth to the land
 and water on a journey of rediscovery and empowerment.
