RECOMMENDATION to Consider and Resolve:

THAT Council endorse the City of West Kelowna Corporate Climate Action Plan.

STRATEGIC AREA(S) OF FOCUS

Invest in Infrastructure – We will invest in building, improving and maintaining infrastructure to meet the needs of, and to provide a high quality of life for, current and future generations.

Foster Safety and Well-Being – We will pursue through direct action, advocacy, and collaboration with local and regional service providers, investments in community health, needs-based housing, emergency preparedness, policing, and other services that foster safety and well-being in West Kelowna.

BACKGROUND

Development of the City's Corporate Climate Action Plan began in the Spring of 2023, guided by Council's Strategic priorities and in collaboration with the Community Energy Association and City staff representatives forming a Technical Committee. The draft Plan was introduced to Council at the Committee of the Whole on November 21, 2023 for initial consideration and discussion. Additional background information can be found in the previous Council report from November 21, 2023. No changes to the Plan have been introduced since this meeting.

DISCUSSION

Implementation

The Plan and Technical Committee emphasized the need for dedicated staff to implement the actions in the plan more efficiently. Without dedicated staff to implement the plan, the

actions will be implemented by staff from various departments as outlined in the plan. The Plan will be circulated to all departments, following Council adoption, for their review and consideration when developing future work plans.

Corporate emissions are currently reported annually to the Province as part of the Local Government Climate Action Program (LGCAP). Annual reporting to the Province acts as an annual check in on progress toward meeting reduction targets. This reporting only provides high level insights on emissions and would not highlight any climate action in detail that was taken in a given year.

Other options for reporting emissions on an ongoing basis will be considered operationally and may include additional language within Council report templates on Climate Action Implications, and/or inclusion of climate action implications in the budgeting process. Both recommendations have been outlined in the Plan for consideration.

Should the City choose to dedicate full time staff to the implementation of this plan, incentive programs such as BC Hydro's Energy Manager Program offers an opportunity to cover 50% of the salary (to a maximum of \$60,000) of a new hire who could develop a strategic energy management plan, secure budgets and business cases, monitor progress of the plan and identify other opportunities for grants/incentives to implement actions.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The Corporate Climate Action Plan does not outline detailed costs of the plans implementation as costing would need to be determined on a case-by-case basis. It is anticipated that future budget asks will be brought forward related to the implementation of this plan, outlining implementation costs for a specific action. A number of grants and incentives related to implementation may be available to the City and are outlined in the Plan. The Plan indicates that approximately \$700,000 annually in energy costs could be saved through implementation of all actions in the Plan. This does not include costs to implement actions, however, savings could be realized long term should actions be implemented.
