The high density zoning for Westbank City Centre desperately needs attention. With the incredible growth in population seen in the last 3-5 years in the downtown core, the Mayor and councillors must take action and build bike lanes and sidewalks providing a much safer urban living for this community. Elliot Road is absolutely horrendous and filled with low visibility side streets such as Gossett road, Springer Lane and Berring Road. Elliot Road is notorious for speeders in this heavily populated nieghbourhood where families are in harms way when trying to exit their vehicles with their kids to cross Elliot road to get to their apartment buildings. Taking dogs for walks, kids to the park on Bering, and riding your bike is a huge risk to ones physical health. Urban living is quite fantastic when cities use traffic control measures to slow vehicles. Pyschological Speed control measures have to be implemented along Elliot road with use of concrete medians and planters to make roads seem narrower than they are causing people to slow. "Vehicles Turning" "Low Visibility" signs would be great for the poor visibilty side streets along Elliot Road. Bike lanes need to be introduced and promoted to help reduce greenhouse gases - but people need to feel safe to ride their bikes and westbank is not safe especially for the children that live in this neighbourhood. Elliot road needs a complete makover not a small improvement, and it needs to happen this year. There are many more high rise buildings that will be developed in the coming years, yet, with the few we have now, the City has failed its downtown community and needs to be better in building a safer place by committing to an infrastructure plan that takes a common sense

approach. You cant just dump a bunch of condos everywhere and spend all the tax payer money in Lakeview Heights. Also- please get rid of the dog park at the lake and open it for familiea and their kids! Dogs dont need their on park on okanagan lake.




