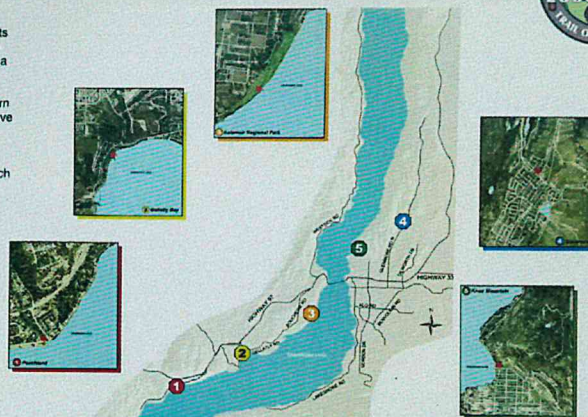

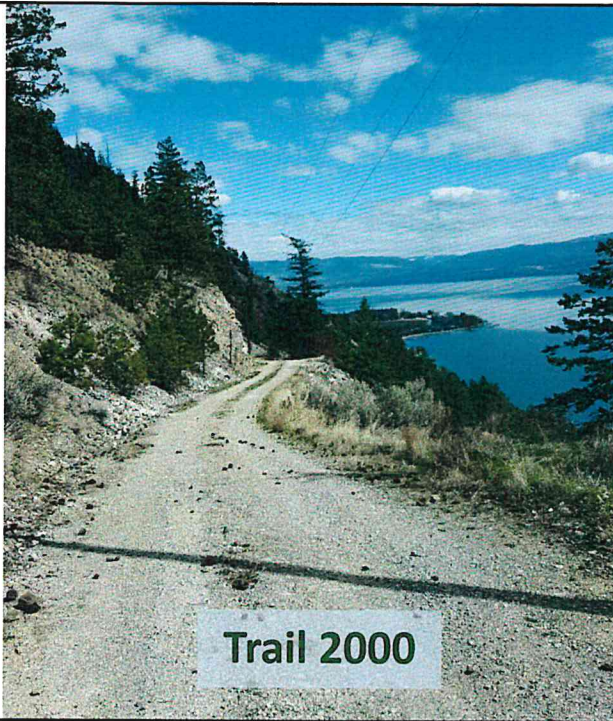

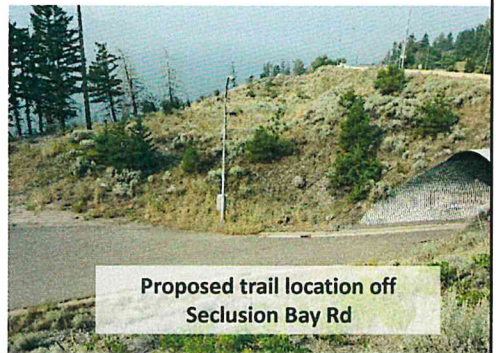
Okanagan Trail of Discovery



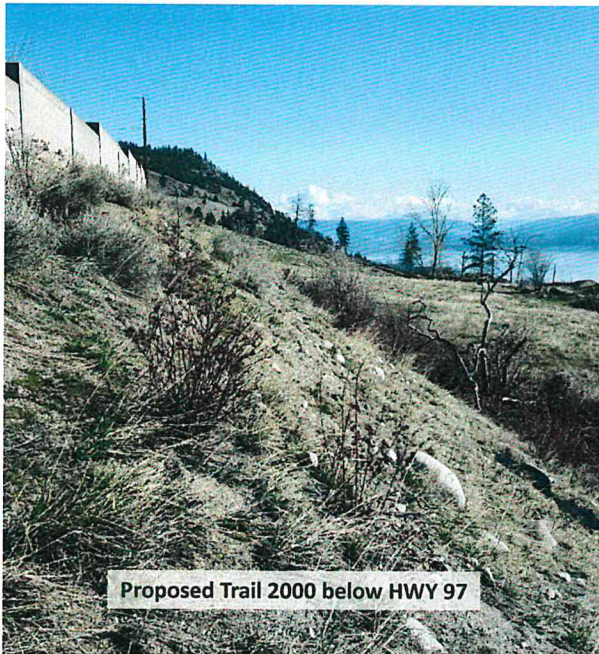
Trail 2000



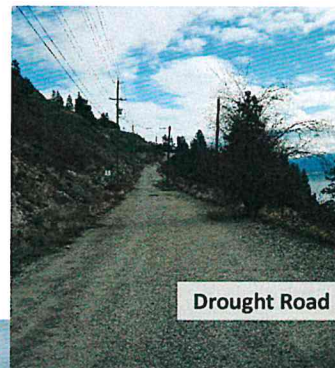
Trail through Goats Peak Park



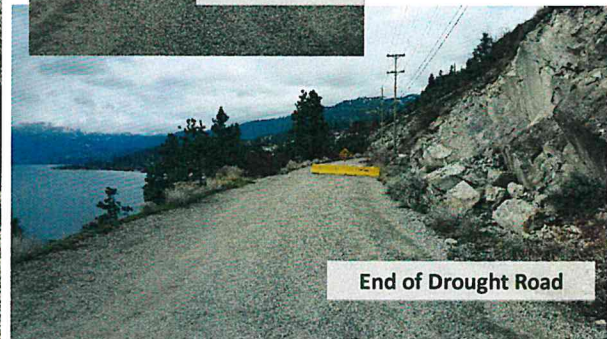
**Proposed trail location off
Seclusion Bay Rd**



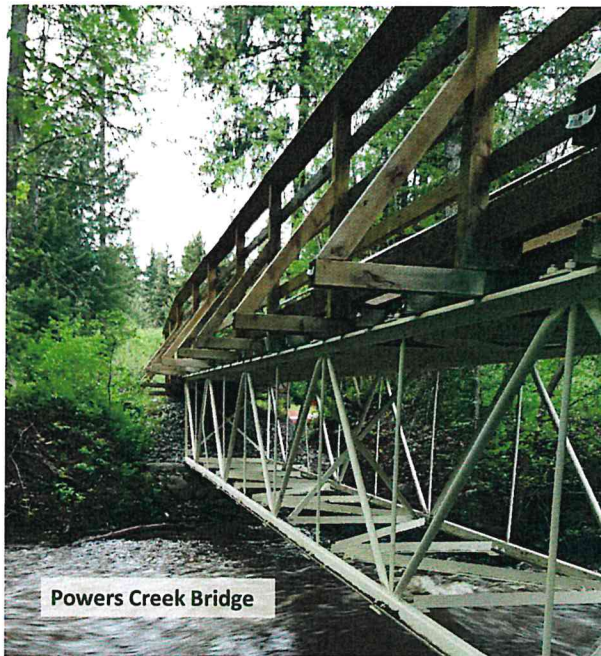
Proposed Trail 2000 below HWY 97



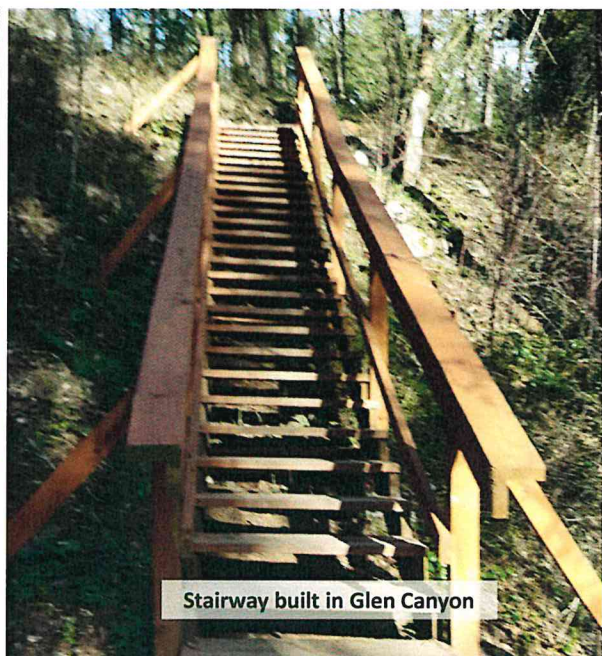

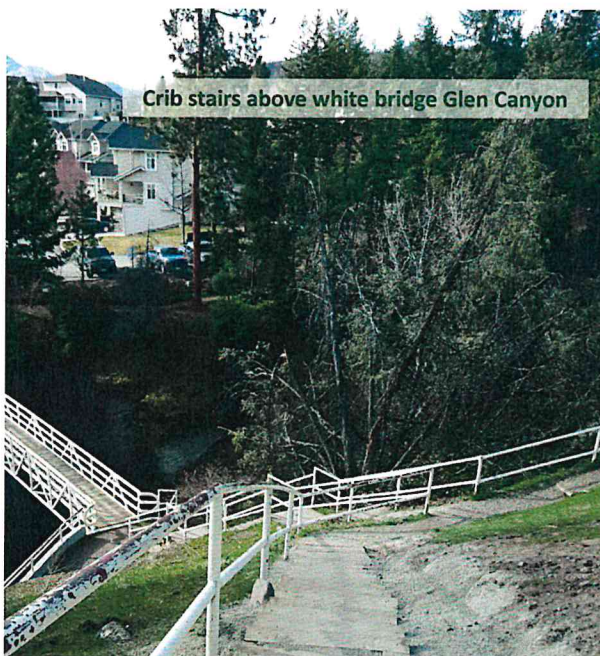

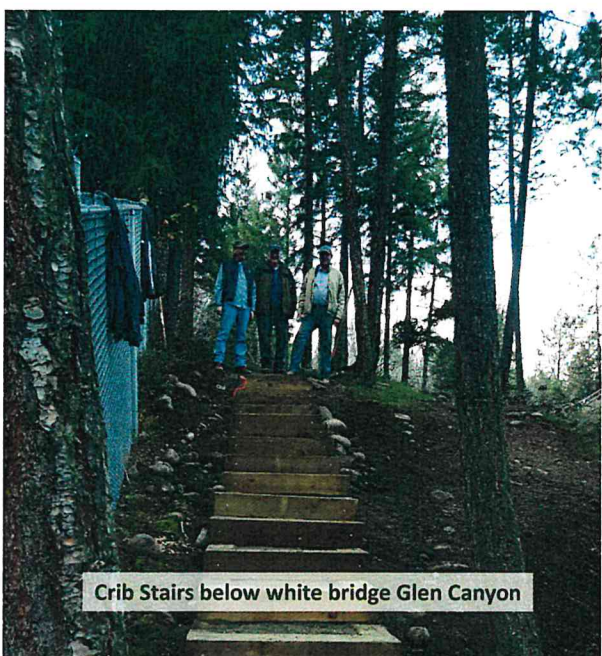

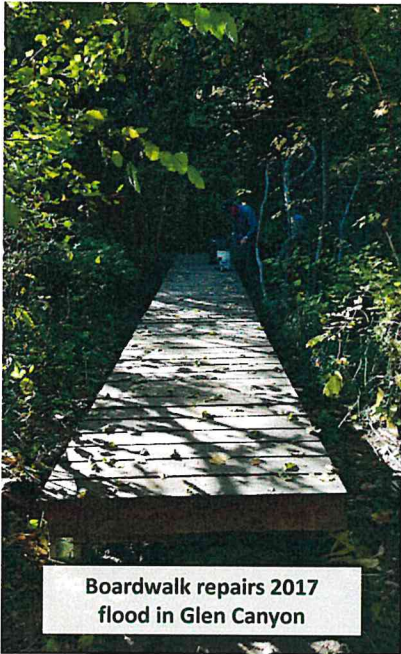

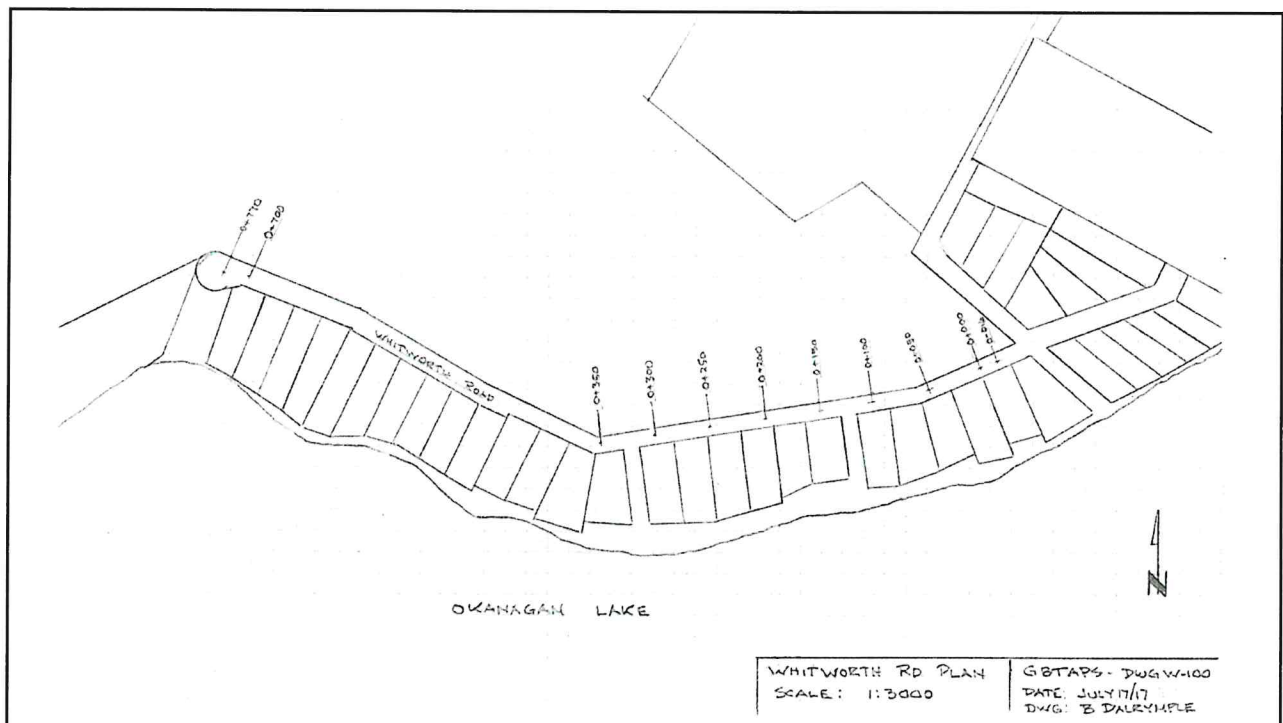
