Emergency Response

- Coordination of a "Social Response Task Force" with these goals:
 - Help social service sector prepare for climate related emergencies.
 - Ensure those most vulnerable such as the unhoused and seniors have the support they need during a traumatic event.
 - Help address unmet needs that were recognized in 2023 such as donation management and volunteers.
 - Emergency funds are activated to not-for-profit organizations to apply for in the case of an emergency.
- Committee members include: Local Government / ESS / Interior Health / BC Housing / Not-for-profit partners




