BACKGROUND

The purpose of this report is to provide Council an overview of the upcoming winter holiday season as well as provide Council information on programs and events that have taken place, since Council was last updated on June 25, 2024.

STRATEGIC AREA(S) OF FOCUS

Winter Holiday Events

Community events this winter holiday season include:

Light Up Event

This year's event will be held on December 6^{th} from 5:00 pm – 7:30 pm with Fire Works at 7:45 pm.

The Light Up event includes a variety of diverse fun family friendly activities including:

- New children's art, craft and activity stations
- The 2nd annual Holiday Craft Show at Lions Hall.
- More Food & Beverage Vendors
- Santa and the Mayor procession along Brown Road
- Festive Fireworks in the Westbank Centre

For 2024 Light Up event includes new diverse, cultural and interactive activities for the community to enjoy including:

- Indigenous traditional activity stations
- Warriors hockey skills activity stations
- Inflatable holiday themed obstacle course activity station
- Snowboarding simulation station
- Carnival activity station

Polar Pancake Pajama Party

The Polar Pancake Pajama Party was added to the holiday event schedule in 2022. The City is again partnering with the Westbank Lions Club to host the event which includes a family pancake breakfast, photo booth, and craft stations. The event will be hosted at the Westbank Lions Community Centre on Sunday December 8th from 9:00 am – 11:00 am for children under 12 years and their family.

Twinkle Tour

The Twinkle Tour is a program that aims to brighten the holiday season in West Kelowna by encouraging residents and businesses to decorate their homes and storefronts with festive lights and cheerful displays. Participants can submit their locations to be included on a public map, allowing the community to then take a self-guided tour and enjoy the light displays and all the submissions are considered for the contest.

Categories for this year's competition include:

- Best Home
- Best Business
- Best Street/Cul de Sac
- Other (Apartments and Care Facilities)

Submissions for inclusion on the tour map and/or to enter the contest are accepted between November 22nd and December 10th. Judging Day is Friday December 13th Winners will be announced on Tuesday, December 17th.

Summer Program and Events Update

West Kelowna Multicultural Celebration

West Kelowna Multiculturalism Day was held from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm on Saturday, June 29, 2024. The success of the past two years lead event organizers to request a change of venue from the Westbank Lions Community Centre to the much larger outdoor setting at Memorial Park and the Annette Beaudreau Amphitheatre. This year the event hosted 2541 participants which is a significant increase from the 1613 people that attended the event last year.

Canada Day & Westside Daze

The City of West Kelowna works with the Westside Celebration Society to host the annual Canada Day and Westside events.

The event dates were:

- Canada Day: Monday, July 1st from 11:00 am to 5:00 pm and Memorial Park and Annette Beaudreau Amphitheatre
- Westside Daze: Friday, July 12th to Sunday, July 14th

This year the Celebration Society brought in new activities to engage children and families including:

- Giant inflatable obstacle course
- Giant Zorb balls arena
- Foam party activities
- Reptile Queen- interaction with various reptiles and spiders
- Velcro sticky wall
- Bumper boats for small children
- Free, jumbo freezies for all attendees
- Free Canada Day cowboy hats

Music in the Park

The Music in the Park program consists of 8 Friday night shows providing live music performances, food trucks and park play activities for children. The event is held at the Memorial Park and the Annette Beaudreau Amphitheatre. The 2024 event schedule started on June 28th and ran weekly until August 30th with two exceptions:

• On Friday July 12th live music was provided as part of the annual Westside Daze celebration.

• The August 23rd show was postponed and held on August 30th due to a lightning storm.

Attendance numbers for the Music in the Park program increased in 2024. A total of 6561 people attended the event in 2024 compared to 5425 attendees in 2023. The average attendance per show in 2024 was 960 compared to 775 in 2023.

Summer Day Camps

This year the Recreation and Culture Department was able to host a variety of camps at Mar Jok Elementary School and the Mt. Boucherie Community Centre using a variety of indoor and outdoor spaces available on site. The combination of program diversity and prime location were key to the success of the camps.

Fall Program and Events Update

Art Exhibition

This Fall, 22 artists and 293 participants took part in the Fall Art Exhibition at Lions Hall. While the Spring Art Exhibition hosted 23 artists and 228 participants. The event ran on Saturday October 19th from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm and Sunday October 20th from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm.

Spooky Swamp Swim

This event includes a public swim hosted at Johnson Bentley Memorial Aquatic Centre in a Halloween themed environment along with games, decorations, music and treats. The Spooky Swamp Swim was held on October 26th from 2:00 pm – 4:00 pm and sold out with150 participants registered.

Halloween DJ Skate

The Halloween DJ Skate is an event where participants are invited to dress in costume, while enjoying a Halloween themed public skate with music and decorations. The event includes a costume contest and goodie bags for all participants. The DJ Skate was held on October 29th from 6:45 – 8:00 pm in Jim Lind Arena. The event sold out with 100 participants registered.
