

## **About UBC Okanagan**

- Established in 2005 in answer to a resounding call from the community for a world-class research university in BC's Southern Interior
- UBCO's identity is shaped by its foundational partnership with the Okanagan Nation
- The campus is known for combining a globally-recognized university education with a close-knit learning community

11,913 Students enrolled

1,399 Graduate students

774 Self-identified Indigenous students

1 in 6 UBC Students study at the Okanagan campus





# Indigenous engagement

- UBC Okanagan is situated in the traditional, ancestral and unceded territory of the Syilx Okanagan Nation
- The university was welcomed by Okanagan Nation Alliance Chiefs through ceremony (knaqs npi'lsmist) and with the signing of an MOU (most recently renewed in 2023)
- Since 2005, UBCO and the Okanagan Nation have worked in partnership to enhance education and support Okanagan Indigenous culture, history, language, philosophy and knowledge
- Working collaboratively with the ONA and communities to realize Truth and Reconciliation commitments that advance Indigenous teaching, research, and language revitalization





# **Teaching and learning**

- Working with the Province to grow high-demand programs like Engineering, Nursing, Social Work and Data Science; launch new programs like the Master of Biotechnology
- Supporting cultural revitalization through Indigenous language fluency programs delivered in partnership with the En'owkin Centre and Nicola Valley Institute of Technology
- Diversifying credentials available on campus to support lifelong learning (e.g. micro-credentials to meet labour market needs)
- Targeted recruitment for key professional grad programs (e.g. Masters of Design; Management; Social Work; Data Science; Engineering; Education; Biotech)





## **UBC** Okanagan in the community

- We bring young, diverse and talented people (students, faculty and staff)
  into the community
- Students who learn here tend to stay here
- Nearly 30,000 UBCO alumni (cumulative)

~25% of UBCO students come from the Okanagan

~50% of UBCO alumni stay in the region

69% of UBCO Nursing graduates hired by Interior Health in last two years = 200 new nurses

## Local research with global impact

#### Small Steps for Big Changes (SSBC) - Dr. Mary Jung

- Reducing type-2 diabetes risk through evidence-based behaviour-change counselling
- SSBC is more effective than oral medication at reducing Type-2 diabetes; 85% of participants no longer have Type-2 Diabetes
- It started right here in Kelowna and is now available at YMCA locations across
  Canada and Australia

#### **Battery Innovation Centre – Dr. Jian Liu**

- Accelerating next-generation battery development and deployment
- Working with Kootenay-based industry partners to:
  - Develop new recycling methods to recover, repair and reuse materials from end-of-life lithium-ion batteries
  - Find ways to reuse tellurium from mining waste reducing dependence on lithium/mining in other jurisdictions
- Fostering a circular economy and an Okanagan clean tech hub





# Local research with global impact

### Wildfire research – Dr. Mathieu Bourbonnais

- Pursuing solutions to help communities predict, plan for and prevent destructive wildfires
- Partnership with BC Wildfire Service, Rogers on sensor/camera network;
  early warning system for wildfires
- Proposal to expand impact by creating the Okanagan Wildfire Lab:
  - Testing: controlled combustion experiments to evaluate resiliency of home building and landscaping materials to wildfire; supporting further development of FireSmart guidelines
  - Training: hands-on experience in fire risk mitigation methods such as prescribed fire burns
  - Technology: specialized environment for developing and calibrating next-generation wildfire sensor technologies and systems

- Interdisciplinary research space for social sciences, natural sciences, humanities, creative fields and professional disciplines
- Includes 100- and 200-seat lecture theatres
- Supports Indigenous learning on campus, including Indigenous language fluency programs; home for Interior Salishan Studies Centre





# **District Energy Decarbonization**

- New CO2 air source heat pump plant
- Will achieve a 30% reduction in total campus GHG emissions
- Working with Vitalis a local cleantech firm founded by UBCO alumni and entrepreneur James Seabrook (BASc 2011)

  - Passive House Certified
  - Opened August 2021
  - 220 beds (1st year students)
- Nechako Residence and Commons
  - 400+ seat Pritchard Dining Hall
  - Opened August 2021
  - 220 beds (1st year students)

    - South campus area near Nonis Field/John Hindle Dr.
    - 250 studio and 2-bed units



# Athletics and Recreation

- Gym expansion
  - Concept: 2,300 sq m facility with two or three gyms, studios, change rooms, washrooms, and equipment storage
  - Will fill a significant gap in recreation and athletics space
  - UBCO students supported funding this expansion via referendum vote
- Nonis Field turf replacement
  - New artificial turf and infill meets
    FIFA Quality standards for competitive play
