- Established in 1991, encompassing properties originally mapped out under the Veterans' Land Act to provide farming opportunities for servicemen following the Second World War, as well as adjoining neighbourhoods of Sunnyside and Mission Hill.

What we've done

- Successfully lobbied Mayor and Council for more appropriate development in the community center (Anders Road). Thank you for your support.
- Lobbied the City of West Kelowna to provide a sizeable amount of green space to replace the loss of a sports field and playground.
- Worked with the Friends of Kalamoir Park and Casa Loma Association to avoid overdevelopment of this important conservation area. Thank you for your support.
- Provided considerable input to the Parks and Trails Master plan.
- Submitted comments on the bike lanes and sidewalks portion of the Transportation Master Plan.


What now?

- Parks continue to top our list of priorities as infill housing continues. We need a clear process and budget to acquire active parks in our community
- Trails and road safety also high on our list. Sidewalk coverage is very poor. More pedestrian/bike paths are urgently required, especially along high traffic roads (Boucherie, Anders, Thacker, Gregory)
- Will continue to monitor residential and commercial development in our area to ensure that the OCP lives up to its stated intentions.
- Agree with other community associations that we need electrical power redundancy. Also agree that solar power should be encouraged.
