Transportation is vital to connecting people and places across the region and supporting the Central Okanagan's growing population, economy and quality of life.




The Sustainable Transportation Partnership of the Central Okanagan (STPCO):

- STPCO: Regional Transportation Governance from 2013 to 2020
- STPCO Dissolved: end of 2020 following completion of the Regional Transportation Plan



- Regional Transportation Plan (RTP):
  - "The current preference among the partners is to dissolve the STPCO and align with and transfer the current functions to the RDCO."

#### Worked together to EXPLORE and DEFINE a Regional Transportation Service



- Explore what a 'Regional Transportation Service' should be, 4 years since STPCO.
- Regional Transportation Service 'matrix' endorsed by all Subject Matter Experts for Board consideration
- Framed in a way that clearly outlines responsibilities
- Envision service continuing from where it was:
  - Same magnitude of expense and scope
  - Focus on enabling regional planning and collaboration
  - Not consolidating other programs or services

### Benefits of Regionally Coordinated Transportation

- Enhanced connectivity and mobility
- Strategic investment in regional infrastructure
- Unified and efficient application and use of grants
- Integrated provincial and local transportation systems
- Integrated active transportation networks
- Collaborative technical coordination and recommendation
- Regional consistency in service delivery, policy implementation, and reporting
- Regional perspectives and opportunities for broad community input

### Key Deliverables (formerly purview of STPCO)

- Approx \$250K per year for project management, regional engagement, and delivery of key regional transportation plan updates and data collection efforts, such as:
  - Regional Transportation Plan, 2020
  - Regional Bicycling and Trails Master Plan, 2020
  - Westside Trail Brief, 2020
  - Central Okanagan Goods Movement Study, 2023
  - Okanagan Travel Survey, 2007, 2013, 2018, 2024
  - Integrated Regional Plan (potential future funding requirement)

### Key Deliverables (formerly purview of STPCO)

- Approx \$150K per year for project management and delivery of programs to help reduce traffic congestion and emissions across the region, such as:
  - School Traffic Safety Officer Position –safety for students to bike and walk to school
  - GoByBike Week supports mode share targets & encourages trips by bike
  - SmartTRIPS website one-stop education resource for walking, biking, transit

# West Kelowna Cost / Benefit Summary

• Cost: \$64,000

### Benefits:

- Inclusion in the delivery of regional transportation programs, rather than having to administer independently
- Staff and elected official role and voice in the update and delivery of key regional transportation plans, facilitated by the RDCO
- Advocacy to the province on behalf of the entire region for regionally significant transportation infrastructure that benefits West Kelowna residents
- Payment submitted to RDCO as part of regional funding process, rather than invoiced separately by City of Kelowna



## Timeline



## May 2025 - Board Direction:

**THAT** the Regional Board receives the Regional Transportation Service report from the Associate Director of Engineering Services dated May 15, 2025, for information;

**AND THAT** the Regional Board directs staff to obtain the written consent of the Central Okanagan Electoral Area East Director and Central Okanagan Electoral Area West Director to expand the boundary of the regional transportation service to include the City of Kelowna, City of West Kelowna, District of Peachland, District of Lake Country and Westbank First Nation;

**AND THAT** the Regional Board directs staff to seek the consent, by resolution, of the City of Kelowna, City of West Kelowna, District of Peachland, District of Lake Country and Westbank First Nation to participate in the regional transportation service;

**AND FURTHER THAT** staff report back to the Regional Board.

## **Consent Resolution**

**WHEREAS** the Regional District of Central Okanagan (the "RDCO") is giving consideration to Bylaw No. 1573 – Amendment No. 2 to Regional District of Central Okanagan Transportation Demand Management Extended Service Establishment Bylaw No. 831, 1999 (the "Bylaw");

**AND WHEREAS**, the Bylaw proposes to amend the boundaries of the service area for the RDCO's Transportation Demand Management Extended Service to include the City of West Kelowna as a participating area;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to the Bylaw, the entire area of City of West Kelowna is to form a participating area under the Bylaw;

**AND WHEREAS**, pursuant to sections 346, 349(1) and 350 of the *Local Government Act*, the Council for the City of West Kelowna can provide participating area approval by consenting on behalf of the electors to the adoption of the Bylaw and notifying the Regional Board of its consent;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the City of West Kelowna consents to the adoption of the Bylaw and directs staff to provide notice to the Regional Board of such consent.
