Responsibilities



- Create guidelines for Canadian drinking water quality
- Advise and fund First Nations water systems

- Develop standards and guidelines under the Drinking Water Protection Act (DWPA)
- Sources and watersheds, guidelines, authorizations
- Oversee status monitoring and reporting
- Infrastructure funding and governance
- Emergency management and coordination

Monitoring Water Quality



Chemical Detected

- Report to the health authority
- Conduct additional sampling
- Plan and implement corrective actions



Manganese

- Complaints of discoloured water July 2024
- Elevated manganese at locations throughout the distribution system
- System operators respond ~ oxidize water before filters
- Exploring options for long-term source and treatment improvements



Disinfection Byproducts

- Disinfection byproducts (DBP) change depending on water quality and temperature
- Quarterly testing throughout the distribution system
- Potential health concern when quarterly average of DBP are above guidelines
- Pre-oxidation for manganese in July 2024 resulted in increased DBPs in the West Kelowna system



Emergency Response



Public Notification

Notification Types:

- Water Quality Advisory (WQA)
- Boil Water Notice (BWN)
- Do Not Consume (DNC)
- Do Not Use (DNU)





McDougall Creek Wildfire

- Fire damage can release volatile organic compounds (e.g. benzene, toluene)
- A **Do Not Consume** public notice issued in August 2023
- The advisory was lifted when no volatile organics above the MAC were detected


