



- The West Kelowna Community Safety Unit (CSU) has done some extraordinary work this quarter.
 An innovative project, teaming up the unit with Loss Prevention officers at multiple local stores, led to seven theft charges, two breach charges and one charge for diving while prohibited. There were also six theft files that resulted in storewide bans. This project not only built a rapport with community members, but also aided with theft prevention.
- CSU was also instrumental in locating a stolen truck where several illegal firearms were seized, including a sawed-off shotgun and a .22 rifle with a silencer. The unit forwarded charges against two individuals arrested in the truck.
- During this quarter, the detachment's "bait" truck was stolen and unit members swiftly recovered it and forwarded charges to Crown.
- CSU also recovered another four stolen trucks, a U-Haul and a snowmobile. Charges were forwarded in relation to the stolen trucks.





- The School Resource Officer (SRO) has been very engaged in the community during this quarter.
- The SRO delivered 12 presentations to elementary and middle school students;
- Took part in a drum making workshop along with Indigenous Policing Services for Indigenous students at Constable Neil Bruce Middle School;
- Hosted a successful "Lunch with the Law" program
